## Description

The DF200 Aqualine is a rubber swim fin manufactured by CY Handee of Kedah, Malaysia. It is available in one or two colours, including black, grey, light blue, dark blue, yellow, red, green and orange. It may be colour-coordinated by size for ease of identification, as with Aqualung Sport fins.

### Features:

- Ideal for use in swimming, snorkelling and skin diving.
- Made from quality natural rubber from Malaysia.
- Good size range from junior to adult.
- Available in floating and non-floating quality.
- Soft full-foot pocket for a more comfortable fit and better feet protection.
- Open-toe design makes it easy to clear sand, pebbles and silt.
- Stiff blade and reinforced side rails for good thrust and propulsion.
- Tread on heel for better foothold.

## Antecedents

Over many years, the DF200 has proved its worth as a “resort fin” for casual and organised snorkel tourism in Hawaii and elsewhere, particularly when colour coded by size:



As a popular traditional rubber fin with a soft, comfortable, medium-width foot pocket for snorkelling and swim training, the DF200 design has remained unchanged for several decades. Although the heel tread has a herringbone pattern, the rest of the sole resembles the lower side of the original DF100 fin design.

Over the decades and around the world, many leading brands in the swim goods industry have opted for the DF200 fin design, either entire or die-cut.
